Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day 2021

I was honored to attend several Pearl Harbor Day Rememberance Ceremonies this month.

80 years have passed since the attack on Pearl Harbor which not only engaged the United States in World War II, but also cost 2,335 Americans their lives. There were 2,008 Navy personnel, 109 Marines, and 218 Army casualties the day of the attack making it one of the worst attacks on American soil. 1,177 of these deaths were from the USS Arizona, a United States Navy Battleship and 8 Navy Battleships were either damaged or sunk. The attack on December 7th, 1941 has been remembered as a day in which many Americans on the island of Honolulu fought to defend their country, even under the dire circumstance.

On August 23, 1994, Congress designated December 7th as National Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day. Events are still held at Pearl Harbor every year to honor and remember the service members and civilians who were killed that day.

This Remembrance Day, I spent time with World War II Veterans to honor the anniversary of Pearl Harbor and to hear from the personal experiences of these Veterans. I was also happy to see eleven standout high school students win their Ted Brattin Civic Youth Awards. It's important to teach and ensure that future generations will understand the valor and legacy of all those who perished fighting throughout the war.

Illinois getting \$17 Billion from Infrastructure Bill

This past month, the United States Congress passed the \$1 trillion infrastructure bill and President Biden signed the law with bipartisan support. This is the largest ever investment to our country's infrastructure. The passage of this bill is not only important to Illinois, but ensures that long overdue repairs are given to our state's buildings, roads, pipes, and more.

The Infrastructure and Jobs Act:

- Stimulates economic growth with the creation of millions of jobs
- Repairs crumbling highways, roads, and bridges.
 - There are over 2,300 bridges and 6,000 miles of highways in Illinois that are deemed "poor condition"
- Replaces lead pipes and delivers clean drinking water
 - Illinois has the most lead pipes of any state in the country
- Improves buildings across the state to sustain extreme weather such as tornadoes, heavy rain, and colder temperatures/snowfalls
 - In the past decade, Illinois has experienced 48 extreme weather event, costing Illinois \$50 Billion in damages
- Builds a national network of electric vehicle chargers
 - Propels Illinois to Increase electric vehicle production and investment
- Expand broadband internet access to help connect every Illinois resident to reliable, safe, and high-speed internet

Illinois isn't expected to receive the dollars until the first few months of next year, but I am excited to see that our state will finally get major repairs. Learn more about the Infrastructure Bill and all its components **Here.**



Illinois Rental Payment Program <u>Dec. 6th</u> - Jan. 9th

Tenants behind on rent due to Covid-19 can apply for up to \$25,000 in rental assistance through the Illinois Rental Payment Program between December 6th and January 9th!



The Illinois Rental Payment Program provides assistance to eligible Illinois renters impacted by the Covid-19 Pandemic. Tenants whose application is approved will receive a one-time grant of up to \$25,000 paid directly to their landlord to cover missed rent payments beginning June 2020 and prepay payment through April 2022, or until the grant is exhausted, whichever comes first. Both landlords and tenants participate in the joint application process.

ILRPP is designed to help tens of thousands of Illinois renters avoid eviction and stay safe and in place during this public health crisis. Please note: an application is not a guarantee of assistance.

The Community Veteran Peer Training is available at no cost to veterans willing to serve their fellow veterans in the Aurora Region. Veterans must be willing to complete a 3-day virtual peer training course, plus one additional day (TBD) of Mental Health First Aid Training.

PURPOSE

The goal of the Community Veteran Peer Supporter course is to prepare Veterans with the skills to assist other Veterans who are going through difficult transitions as it relates to social determinants of health.

OUTCOMES

Upon completion of the course:

- 1. Veterans will be well versed in the use of problem-solving tools such as motivational interviewing and SMART goals to assist another Veteran to develop their own goals.
- 2. Create strategies for self-empowerment, and take concrete steps towards building fulfilling, self- determined lives for themselves.
- 3. Peer supporter ethics will instruct on setting appropriate peer to peer boundaries and strategies to implement them.
- 4. Mental Health First Aid will reinforce the role of the Community Veteran Peer Supporter as a lay person lacking clinical expertise and insight and to clearly define the role as one of a peer providing support.

COMMITMENT

- 1. 30 hours of Virtual Peer Training.*
- 2. Must be available for training on January 13th, 14th, 15th ~ 2022. And, one addition day of training. TBD.
- 3. Agree to serve other Aurora Region Veterans for up to 10 hours a month for a minimum period of 12 months after completion of the


